SWFT Clinical Services Ltd is a wholly owned subsidiary of South Warwickshire NHS Foundation Trust, which was one of the first in the country to set up a limited company as a business subsidiary.

We operate the outpatient pharmacy for the Trust based at Warwick Hospital, a private patient day surgery clinic in Stratford-upon-Avon, and most recently have developed a facilities and estates management service, under which we manage the Stratford-upon-Avon hospital on behalf of South Warwickshire NHS Foundation Trust.



Our primary purpose is to make a profit through commercial activities, which are then reinvested in the business, gifted to charitable organisations or returned to the Trust.

The Social Enterprise Mark criteria includes a requirement for all applicants and renewing Mark Holders to answer a set of social impact questions, which illustrate how they are striving to meet their social/environmental objectives.

Below are examples of how **SWFT Clinical Services** is Making a Mark, striving to create a positive impact on people and planet.

Providing patient-centered health and care services

We strive to influence patient choice by providing efficient services, which enable patients to retain ownership of their health and social care requirements.

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To achieve this, we provide services which are primarily influenced, shaped and directed by the end user. For example, home delivery continence products, prescription and medicine outpatient services, establishment and provision of a community and wellbeing centre and consultancy services.

Promoting social inclusion and cohesion

We are driven by the provision of social inclusion and cohesion, not profit margins. All profits generated by trading are either reinvested in the business or returned to the Trust for reinvestment in health care services.

Our services contribute to a much-improved health agenda, which results in patients, users and the wider community having access to joined up services. This drives down medical or drug dependency, resulting in a healthier and more balanced community, thereby reducing the cost burden on the public purse.

Supporting local charities

Through our trading activities, we have been able to redistribute an element of our profits to good causes, e.g. local and regional charities undertaking complimentary activities, which without our donation would not be able to continue at such a high operational capacity.



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
